Research focus

My research in the area of **Health Psychology** is focused on deepening knowledge about the role of psychological factors in health and illness, as well as the need for developing socio-scientists’

and health researchers' skills in conducting research within ethical standards. Considering the limitations in hitherto huge emphasis on chemo-therapeutic approaches in optimising health, attention to underlying psychological factors has been largely neglected. To address these, my publications focused on three thematic areas, namely; Role of psychological factors in health and illness, effect of psychological interventions in managing some clinical conditions, and ethical issues in health care and research.

(i) Role of psychological factors in health and illness: An enquiry into the role of psychological and social factors in the psychological health of people in resource-limited settings, especially Nigeria, is my research focus. Some of my research activities in this area addressed the inter-play of psychological and social factors in wellness and illness. I also contributed a book chapter in an international compendium, which identified critically relevant issues in Yoruba culture, with a call to clinicians to consider cultural contextualization in establishing psychological wellness or illness. Specifically, I established the role of psychological factors in the psychological well-being of vulnerable populations e.g.; surgical patients, pregnant career women, lower-limb amputees, youth with disabilities, HIV orphans, infertile post-salpingectomy patients, and people exposed to Lassa fever. These revealed the relevance of some psychological factors in obtaining psychological wellness in these populations, simultaneously justifying the need to consider such factors in planning and implementing well-being programmes in these populations.

(ii) Effectiveness of psychological interventions in managing some clinical conditions: The adoption of quasi-experimental approaches in some of my research yielded knowledge with great potentials for practical utility. For example, the efficacy of rational emotive therapy in reducing peri-operative anxiety; roles of assertiveness training in reducing sexual risk behavior; and effect of progressive goal attainment programme in selected pain characteristics e.g. catastrophising were established. Some of these interventions have been adopted by clinicians.

(iii) Ethical issues in health care and research: My publications contributed to knowledge, as well as practical skills for overcoming peculiar ethical challenges in clinical practice, logotherapy, informed consent in social science and multi-national research, and research ethics regulation; while appropriate recommendations to overcome the challenges were made to equip researchers and clinicians with skills for conducting research in line with national and global ethical standards.
